

ften asked how he got into the business of architecture, Jimmy Mistry is known to reply, "I didn't; the business got into me." The principal designer and MD of Della Tecnica Architects and Interior Designers, launched over a decade ago, is a name to be reckoned with in Indian architectural circles. This is quite creditable for someone who is not a qualified architect. Today, his company has to its credit several residential and commercial complexes, IT parks and hospitality projects. But Mistry started off in a humble fashion by undertaking contractual assignments for building repair and maintenance.

His big break came when he was offered the chance to work with furniture, and he abandoned his studies in Mechanical Engineering when he found his destiny. It was the furniture design magazine, L'Officio, that triggered off a completely new direction. "Inspired by Italian office furniture, I contacted Olivetti Synthesis and, on their invitation, went to Italy - which turned out to be the turning point of my career," discloses Mistry. "The designers introduced me not just to their design, but also their methods of manufacturing and marketing. They exposed me to a new world of interior design, and the worlds of studios like Charles Pollock, El DialoManenni."

Mistry's design philosophy is simple: "Each structure we work on should be a landmark," says the man whose landmark projects include the UB headquarters in Bengaluru (18 floors, including Dr Vijay Mallya's personal yacht); Sushanto Roy Sahara's shopping mall in Sahara Gunj, Lucknow; Bajaj headquarters in Pune and Bajaj Probiking retail stores across India (which won the VMRD Retail Design Award 2008).

Mistry revels in the freedom that designing for hospitality offers him. Not surprisingly, he believes that his biggest contribution is the one-of-its-kind Della Extreme Adventure Park near Mumbai, probably India's largest.



rchitecture, in keeping with the spirit of the times, has shed its ideological baggage and embraced unfettered free-spiritedness in aesthetics, is globalised, democratic and ambitious," states Kalhan Mattoo, who is not afraid to go beyond the tried and tested. At Planet 3 Studios, both Kalhan and Santha (as directors) have whipped out refreshingly new design concepts and set themselves apart with their diverse portfolio. Their work has been recognised at both international and national platforms: Spark Design Award 2011, Honor Award from DesignShare, USA'07, World Architecture Community Awards '08, 'Multiplicity' International Product Design Award, USA '08, Artist in Concrete Award 2011, IIA Award for Interiors 2011, Indian Architecture Design Festival - Achievers in Architecture Design, etc.

Today is no different; every day is an exploration to seek the new and the different," quips Santha. Together, they earnestly explore new horizons in design, and introduce spaces that are unconventional but still inviting. At Planet 3, the duo has worked on projects ranging from institutes, banks and corporate offices to restaurants, lounges, resorts, housing, residential interiors, retail, exhibitions, product design and more. They have also ventured into new endeavours focusing on product design and design build projects. With a strong entrepreneurial stride and unmatched design capabilities, their firm continues to sustain a fresh outlook to architecture and design.
