







We have used recycled and 'low-touch' materials. The look was created using an appealing colour palette. It is difficult to define and we like that.

**Concept:** We sent some people from our studio to the existing structure and they just talked to the students there. By doing so we really got an insight into what goes on in the institute we term that as 'data mining'. So we mined many heads and what came across was that their college did not function the way they thought it should. So we went out of the box! We focussed on the students, their needs and drew inspiration from it. Learning need not necessarily happen in a dull boring environment. We wanted to create a design that students connected with and claimed as their own.

**Design:** We understood that the college does not belong to the trustees or the academicians, it primarily belongs to the students and one has to look at the design in terms of the end user. We tried to understand their attraction to the outside, and accordingly we got all of that inside the campus. So we had a *chai ka tapii*, the internet kiosk, we created a man sized chessboard between the blocks, we have a table tennis table, we have an outdoor, indoor café, we have a telephone booth. The walls bend tilt and turn to contain spaces. They break away from the rigidity of sensible and safe architecture. We have used recycled and 'low-touch' materials. The look was created using an appealing colour palette. It is difficult to define and we like that.

**Awards:** We received the 'Designshare Honor Award 2007'.' It is the Oscars of educational facility design worldwide. This is the first time an Indian design firm has received this, it was very exciting for us as it was our first architectural project and because we were experimenting with a bizarre thought that worked in our favour.

**Future Projects:** Currently we are working on a Science Centre, a lifestyle community for NRIs and a product design for a new age workstation is going into production with *Godrej.* Hotels, lounge bars, education facilities, offices, Industrial buildings... you name it\_
